Jan Vikas Samii - An overview.....



Jan Vikas Samii (JVS) is the Social Welfare Wing of Varanasi Province of the Indian Missionary Society (IMS). Currently it has 12 centers situated in Remote Rural areas of four States of North India namely Bihar, Utar Pradesh and Madhya Pradesh.

The major thrust of JVS is to bring structural change in the society in favour of the poor and the marginalized through community based organizaions (CBOs). JVS believes that the strength of the poor is in their number and if our country is to have an integrated development, it can happen only through the collective efforts of the

Vision

To build inclusive humane society based on the values of equality, jusice and brotherhood.

Mission

Empowerment of the marginalized people of the society, especially the Dalits, Women and Children through a process of awareness, organizaion collective acions and advocacy for raising their Socio-Polliical, Educaional, Economic, Health Status and Promoion of Envi-ronment.



Women Empowerment

Women are one of the strategic focus groups of the organisation because the organisation envisages a gender-just society. JVS focuses on gender equality and women's empowerment as human rights. To eliminate all discrimination and all forms of violence against women and the girl children we form women organisations, Self Help Groups (SHG) to strengthen the partnership of women within the civil society. Savings and credit provisions in itself are assumed to contribute to a process of individual economic empowerment through enabling women to decide about savings and credit use. It is assumed that women will then invest in their own economic activity, either agricultural production or micro enterprise, thus increasing incomes which they themselves will be able to control. Women's economic empowerment is then assumed to lead to increased wellbeing for them-selves and their families. Under the animation program of JVS, formation and credit linkages of SHG becomes one of the important programme. The total number of SHGs as on 31st March 2014 is 318. During the course of time, JVS emphasized quality in terms of SHG formation, an intensive and various training programme were organized for the animators to equip them with necessary skills and information. About 100 women of different groups have started the income generation program on their own.

International Women's Day Celebration-2014

To honor and highlight the important role women play in the human society, Jan Vikas Samiti celebrated the International Women's day with the United Nations theme, "Inspiring Change", on 9th March 2014 at the premises of Jan Vikas Samiti. Approximately 2300 women from various Self Help Groups and nearby villages, a number of Government and Non-Government officials, local Pradhans (Head of Village Councils) etc, participated in the event. Prerana Kala Manch awoke the spirits of the audience with a stage play on 'Ganga ho ya Gaangee'. The play focuses on the exploitation of women in the society. A series of colourful programmes were performed by the girls from Bhusaula, Bhitari and a dandiya dance by staff of JVS.

International Day for Girl Child –2013

Along with the Diocese of Varanasi Social Welfare Society, JVS co-partnered in organizing the Girl Child Day Celebration (Balika Diwas) on 12th October, 2013. "Empowering girls, ensuring their human rights and addressing the discrimination and violence they face are essential to progress of the whole human family. The various issues that girls face in their daily life and how these could be overcome were brought forth.

Income Generation Activities (IGAs)



The organization promotes economic empowerment of its focus groups through the mediums of SHGs, micro savings/credit and micro enterprises. At the end of the reporting period, 302 SHGs existed with a strength of 4832 members from the marginalized communities. The number includes the SHGs promoted by with the support of Manos Unidas. The cumulative pool created by these members at the end of the reporting period was Rs. 6819421/- This pool is a result of the micro savings developed among focus women over the years. The togetherness and habit of saving not only saved an amount for the members but also entitled them for hassle-free loan at their doorsteps. In order to save the focus women from the clutches of the moneylenders; the organization promotes productive as well as consumption loan. A total of 2908751 SHG members took productive loan. The productive loan was used for setting up micro enterprises for enhancing family income.

This is worth mentioning that such works have been mainly responsible for making the poor a victim of usurious practices of the moneylenders. But in the changed scenario, the members are not only entitled to soft loan but their vulnerability is also minimized to a large extent.

The micro enterprises set up with the help of SHGs are mainly tea shops, bangle shops, thela, rickshaw, poultry, vegetable cultivation, general store and animal husbandry. At the end of the reporting period, there were a total of 62 micro enterprises existing in the focus area.

Nationalized banks like SBI, Central Bank, Allahabad Bank, Indian Overseas Bank, Punjab National Bank have been supporting the SHGs with institutional linkages and seed money. The association with esteemed banks has been a supportive factor for the SHGs as well as for the organization. From time to time, the capacity of the SHGs was enhanced with the help of training programs that included topics ranging from micro enterprises to group management and record keeping. It is very encouraging to see that the SHG members are contributing to their small savings without any failure despite their poverty. Today these groups, known as Self Help Groups, have become the vehicle of change for the poor and marginalized.

Mass Awareness and Development Communication



Awareness Programmes

The street play team of Jan Vikas Samiti has been very active in spreading awareness in the villages in the districts of Varanasi, Lakkimpur-Kheri and Mirzapur. They have travelled miles and miles to empower the women and to conscientize them towards chasing away the discrimination in the society at all levels through their plays. The street play team has been very successful in strengthening the women who are being tortured and used as a machine at home. After such awareness programmes being conducted through SHG groups the women raised voice against violence against women and have succeeded to get their rights at home and in the society.

The organization has earned a name for itself for adopting and practicing a unique modus-operandi for conveying the development messages to the rural communities. This includes a traditional yet very entertaining method like puppet shows and street plays. The range also includes observance of significant days and rallies. The organization has prepared a team of street plays and of puppeteers. The groups move in the focus area of the parent organization as well as of the like-minded organizations. The presentations are always followed by a healthy and lively discussion with the audience in order to enhance the impact of the message given through the mediums. During the reporting period, a total of 87 puppet shows were held while the number of street plays was 92. The messages on the topics like sanitation, maternal and neonatal health, Panchayati raj, government programs, etc. Apart from these mediums, significant days were also observed at community level with a twin-objective

of making the community aware and enhancing its capacity to organise and manage community level events. The village level function received cooperation from local leaders, Panchayat representatives, educational institutions, CBOs and other stakeholders. The artists of Jan Vikas Samiti perform street plays in the districts of Shahjahanpur, Varanasi and Mirzapur.



Village Development Committees (VDC)

Since a majority of the villages in the country still face constraints such as access to education, health facilities, drinking water, power, roads, credit, information and market, JVS has initiated and has introduced VDCs. It prepares villages especially in back-ward regions by preparing Village Development Programme with the intention of ensuring a holistic and integrated development of the village concerned. The main objective of VDC is to focus on financial inclusion and also to develop the selected village in an integrated manner. This would include economic development, infrastructure development, and other aspects of human development i.e., education, health, drinking water supply etc in collaboration with the Nodal Agency (NGO) and other governmental departments. The VDCs facilitate the villagers to reach and have access to the schemes of the government and other financial assistance etc. for their economic development. The VDCs are formed out of the Representatives from SHGs, Farmer's groups, CBOs and Youth Groups. We are implementing VDC programmes at Saharsha

Children's Parliament

The organization is an ardent advocate of child rights because children form the future of a nation. In order to protect and promote children's rights and build up a 'child-friendly' environment, the organization has been promoting the children's club and children's parliament. The main purpose these are to make children aware of their rights, especially to bring them as a group and to encourage them to mingle with everyone and interact with the others. During the meetings they discuss on various issues, value them and take decisions to act accordingly. Thus the children come to know various things about what is happening around them. We have conducted 6 Children's Parliament meetings in which 264 children took part actively. Among them 170 boys and 94 girls took part.





Community Based Rehabilitation of Persons with Disabilities

Parent's Meeting

Parents along with their children actively participated in the meeting. The main objective of the meeting is to review the progress and achievements in the children's academic and extracurricular activities for last three months. The parents were explained about the Govt. schemes and how to avail benefit out of them, the role of DPD for the betterment of the persons with disabilities and tips on home based therapy and its importance.

The community based rehabilitation programme of JVS has a focus on working in partnership with the parents and families of the children with disability to design and implement a unique plan for each child. These are drawn up as per the needs, abilities of the child, family's expectations etc. These interventions seek to address parents' and families' low levels of awareness, misinformation, little or no aspirations for their children with disabilities. Parents and families are oriented, trained and built up their capacity alongside the child's, so that they can carry on the work with their children

Parent's group

Parents of children with disabilities are part of JVS's work. Apart from regular home visit and meetings with the parents, we are also creating opportunities through some activities where they can all work as groups.



Parent's group takes active interest to organize events and activities with the support from JVS. These include awareness campaigns on World Disability day, International Women's days, girl child day etc.

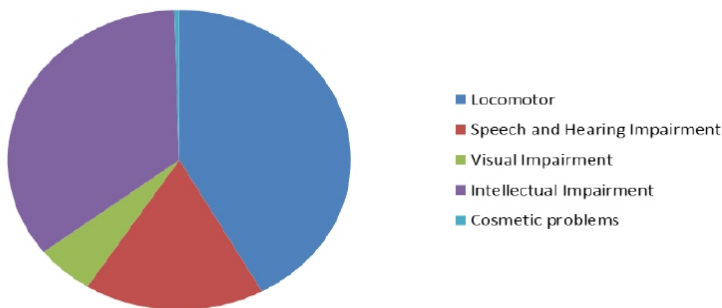


Direct Child Assistance

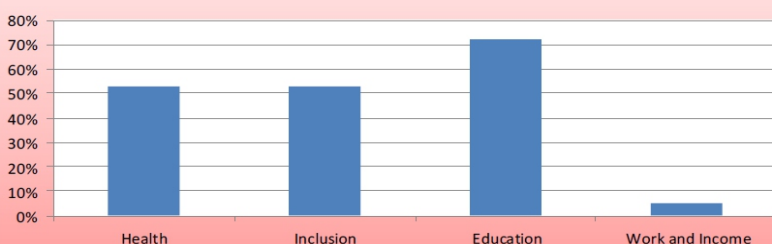

Focus Area wise data



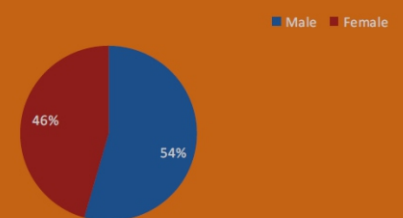
Coordination of Partners

JVS being the strategic partner of Liliane foundation, the Netherlands for North and North East India provided its extensive help to 8447 children with disabilities in North and North east India through its 88 Partner organizations in India and 10 in Nepal.

SANKALPA 2014 - National level Para - Olympics was held on 29th and 30th, 2014 at St. Xavier's School, Jawalakhel, Nepal. The programme Sankalpa-2014 aimed to serve as a platform provider for various children and adults with disabilities to explore the unique talents that they possess. JVS-LF in collaboration with St. Xavier's School has organized this event. Many children with disabilities from different NGOs have participated in it. The winners were given prizes at the closing ceremony on the last day of the event.

Comprehensive Eye Health Services

Vision Centre

JVS established a well-equipped Vision Centre at JVS, for follow up and referral and Refraction purposes. Through this Vision Centre the nearby patients are coming for follow up and referral purposes whereas the persons identified refractive errors are prescribed spectacles as the requirement.

648 people came to have their eye checkup among which 20 persons underwent cataract operation and 79 people are using spectacles. The old and the poor people of this area are benefiting from the Vision Centre.



Community Meeting

JVS organized community level meeting to aware the community people about eye health care activities and Rehabilitation activities for the disabled people specially, for the People with visually impaired. The field staff gave information about preventive measures of the blindness, curative and causes of blindness as very essential component of the program. They also highlighted the rehabilitation components to understand the concept of disabled people's equal participation in the all-round development of their livelihood.

The comprehensive Eye Health Service programme was initiated by JVS in Pindra block of Varanasi District with the aim that no one should be needlessly blind and those with irreversible blindness or low vision should have the same rights and access in the society.

The programme mainly focused on the inclusion of people with visual impairment (VI) in social, economic and other developmental activities of the area,

Economic Rehabilitation of Persons with Visual Impairment (PVI)

JVS initiates to train the persons with Visual Impairments to strengthen them for their self-dependency and earn their daily living through self-employments. Persons with visual impairment are trained under different small scale businesses like, running petty shops, making Garlands and handicrafts etc.

Mobility & Orientation

Orientation and mobility trainings (O & M) help visually impaired persons to know where he is in space and where he wants to go (orientation). It also helps him to be able to carry out a plan to get there (mobility). Through orientation and mobility trainings we focus on the aspects of sensory awareness: gaining information about the world through hearing, smell and touch, special concepts: realizing that objects exist even if not heard or felt, and understanding the relationships which exist between objects in the independent movement: which includes crawling, rolling, walking, etc. sighted guide: using another person to aid in travel, protective techniques: specific skills which provide added protection in unfamiliar areas, cane skills: use of various cane techniques to clear one's path or to locate objects along the way. We do also take care of their areas like daily living skills, bathing, brushing, keeping themselves neat and tidy, managing household activities especially for the women.

Formation of Blind Peoples Organization

The Blind People's Organization (BPO) is an organization in the society which promotes comprehensive rehabilitation of persons with all categories of disabilities through education, training, employment, community based rehabilitation, integrated education, human resource development and other innovative means.

Other activities of BPO ensure that people with disabilities are able to initiate to obtain the maximum service from the government and get access to the schemes and programme of the government. JVS promotes the formation of BPOs in the villages to strengthen the people with visual impairment to take necessary need based initiatives to approach and raise voice for their rights for their own welfare and development

Residential Skill Development Programme for Persons with Visual Impairment (PVI)

JVS conducted regular residential training programme for visually impaired children to help them to fasten their reading and writing in Braille, improve orientation and mobility, skill development, and overall development of the children in their studies and social life. Girls learned cutting vegetables as well as other kitchen related domestic works. They learned how to identify and clean their clothes and also bathing, dressing, going to the toilet, and other things which are necessary in everyday life. The children also got the chance to sing, dance and use musical instruments. This program helped them to develop taste for singing and playing musical instruments, especially drummer, harmonium, symbols etc.





Trainings, Seminars and Workshops for the Visually Impaired

A number of trainings, orientation workshops, seminars, public meetings, skill development programmes etc were organized by JVS in

Pindra block of Varanasi District to create awareness on blindness and low vision, inclusive education, participation in the local governance, updating on the government programmes and welfare schemes, right based approach, linkage of the village groups with banks and government institutions for the financial aid and economic development.

Diagnostic Eye camps

JVS regularly conducts Diagnostic Eye camps in the villages to identify the people with low vision and blindness so as to provide the further assistance for the treatment and medication to ensure the eye health of the community. The identified persons with low vision are referred to the hospitals for further necessary treatments and counteract operations.

School screenings

School screenings are conducted on a regular basis for the primary schools of the area covered by the programme to identify the low vision and other eye disease of the children to provide proper treatment for them to overcome the problems to ensure the eye health of the children.

Educational Initiatives



Day Care Centre

'Muskaan' (Smile) school is an educational initiative by JVS to ensure easy, affordable and appropriate educational access and social development of the most marginalized children with multiple disabilities (CwDs).

The very nomenclature, Muskaan, stands to inculcate the feeling of positivity and to convey the message that Smile is a right of every child despite its disability. Disability can be turned into ability with efforts, dedication and positive attitudes. The centre stands to take care of both physical and social aspects of the mainstreaming of CwDs. These include physiotherapy, medical aid, socialization training, joyful learning,



Inclusive Education For the low vision and visual impaired children

The main purpose of Inclusive education is to include children with Low Vision or Visual Impairment into mainstream of the society. Special teachers are appointed by JVS to support the children with visual impairment and low vision in their academic studies, participation in socio/ co-curricular activities etc. We disincively cover Harahua and Pindra Block of Varanasi district under this programme.

Integrated School in Bhitari

Keeping the vision of the society every effort is made to have inclusive community at our end. To include one of the most marginalized groups in society i.e. children with disabilities is a great success for both the St. Joseph and JVS. We have been preparing this school for many months by conducting orientation programmes for teachers, parents of disabled children and others.



Elementary Education to slum children in Varanasi city for a Self-Reliant Community

There is a great need to offer elementary education to the slum children in order to inculcate certain discipline in the community although it will be a big challenge to make these children attend regular classes. This is a challenge because the parents do not show any kind of interest in educating their children as their immediate concern is their daily bread. However, a few of the slum dwellers have expressed the need of education for their children.

The Educational Program, therefore, has the following motto: *“Promote elementary education, put an end to the child labour.”* Children of 20 slums in Varanasi city are covered under the present programme for education.

A Campaign on Education for All “Ring the Bell”

Jan Vikas Samii organized a campaign —RING THE BELL (education for all) in order to raise awareness about the fact that children with a disability also have the right to go to school. This is stated in the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child (article 23 focuses on children with a disability) and also Millennium Goal 2 focuses on school accessibility for all children by 2015. Since Education for all has been declared into Part III – Fundamental Rights of Indian Constitution, but there are number of children who are not going to school due to disabilities, lack of awareness and various barriers which exist in the society. The staff of JVS went to 15 elementary Government schools in the area of MURDAHA, PUAARIPUR, BHITARI, PUARI KHURD, CHANDAPUR and PINDRA and asked the children to make noise for a minute as loud as possible through different mediums. The campaign was successfully organized in different schools after the morning assembly.

The teachers gathered all the children in the school playground with bells, trumpets, placards, pan lids, posters and they made a lot of noise. The children have participated in the campaign with full zest asking for the right to education for all including children with disabilities.

“Gramin Jagat Shikshan Sahayog” Educational fund is a special initiative taken by JVS to ensure the higher education of the poor children in the operational area of the or-

ganization by building awareness on education of the poor children and motivate the families to save an educational fund for future higher studies of their children. 100 children were enrolled under the programme from the most vulnerable families of the area. Here we salute Bro. Rajesh IMS for his selfless service despite his problems with his own eye sight.

Early Childhood Care Centers (ECCC)

Ten centers are established in ten villages of Kumar Khand Block of Madhepura District, Bihar to take care of the children in the age group of 3 to 5 years. Along with providing the basic nutritional essentials we adopt play way methods to prepare them for schooling, regular medical checkup during the health camps to ensure the good health of the children and occupy them with cultural activities like songs, dances etc. Teachers and Care takers of the centers provide regular building programmes to ensure and increase their self-efficacy to manage the centers and help the children to grow. Teachers use the joyful method of teaching which is interactive, participatory and understandable to the children.

Periodical parents meetings are organized to ensure the participation of the parents in the programme and their children's growth. Besides taking care of the children in the ECC centers, the teachers also took initiative to enroll the grown up children at the government schools in the beginning of the academic year. New children were enrolled in the ECC centers in place of those who got admission in the government schools. We also used the medium of street play to spread the message on importance of education which attracted a large crowd.



Vocational Training programmes for the Youth

Empowerment of the citizens of tomorrow i.e. the youth is an important issue of JVS. The organization considers this powerful segment of society as a platform of collective action and a pressure group. It has been promoting the empowerment of these focus groups through different ways and means. The first and foremost task in this direction is formation of the groups in order to pool the collective energy. From time to time, these groups are sensitised and capacitated on the issues of health, education, responsibility for their villages, access to government programs, etc. At the end of the reporting period, JVS joined hands with AURO SPINNING MILLS, Himachal Pradesh a vocational training centre for the future of these youth. They are being trained for 6 months after which they are given placement according to their standards. So far 91 boys are sent for the vocational training in which 64 boys are given job and the rest 27 boys are undergoing the training.



Community Health Program

"Community health" is a process of enabling people to exercise collectively their responsibility for their own health and to demand good health as their right. It involves the increasing of the individuals, families, communities, organizations, opportunities, knowledge, skills and supportive structures that make health possible. JVS is working in 32 slums of Varanasi for the health issues of slum dwellers. Through

Associations for the Social Marginalized Integrated Therapeutic Action (Asmita) each slum has roughly 800 to 1000 inhabitants.

The components of community health action include.

- Integrating curative with preventive, promotive and rehabilitative activities.
- Involving local, indigenous health knowledge, resources and personnel.
- Training for the village based health workers.
- Initiating and supporting organizations in all aspects of health planning and management.

Generating community support by mobilizing financial resources, labour skills and man power resources from the community etc.

Special Awareness on Tuberculosis (TB)

The primary objective of this activity is to go to the door-step of marginalized and vulnerable communities to inform them about TB, its symptoms, diagnosis, treatment, and RNTCP (Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme) services and how to avail these services in case of need. In the process, we link the identified TB symptomatic to RNTCP services by referring them and/or collecting and transporting the sputum samples to the nearest DMC (Designated Microscopy Centre). If they are found to be having TB then they will be linked to RNTCP treatment services. The place where JVS serves people in the field of TB is as follows:

- ◆ Slum areas
- ◆ Tribal Population and homeless people
- ◆ In pockets or in communities where smoking and or alcoholism is high

The areas are very far away from DMCs/ RNTCP services (Distance to DMC is more than 10 kms.).

Organisaion's capacity was enhanced through training of the staf as well as the focus groups. The staf of the organisaion atended number of training programs that were either organised by JVS or by fellow organisaions/funding agencies. During the year a wide variety of creave methods were employed to build capacity of the target group at various levels. Number of training Programmes, workshops, seminars and other innovaive methods been organized in diferent units with the objecive to enhance the capacity and to strengthen the knowledge on Issues that are afecing us. Trainings on Disability related issues, Child rights, women issues, mother's trainings, Self-Help Group to the unit staf for implementaion of the work in the ield more e ciently and efecively.

A Dream Came True



Ms. Munna Devi, a mother of four children is very thankful to the Swarna Swayam Sahayata Samuh(SHG) for the timely help she got to open a Pe shop in her village located at block Kumar Khand Block, Madhepura district Bihar. The SHG was formed by the women of this village in the year 2009 under the aegis of JVS. Since this group was registered in the Swarna Jayanti Gram Swarajgar yojana it got Rs. 25000.00 from the bank out of which Rs. 10000 was without interest and Rs. 15000 was given at 10% interest. Being the member of this group she could avail a loan of Rs. 4000.00 in the year 2010 for opening the pe shop and out of the earnings from the shop, she fully paid back regularly the loan amount with interest. The needs of her six family members are met absolutely from the income of the shop. Moreover in the year 2013 she was able to conduct the wedding ceremony of her daughter. She and her family members are very happy to have the pe shop. This was something impossible through individual efforts.

Hand pumps made functional

In Bhatpooorvakal village, Harhuwa block of Varanasi district, for the safe drinking water hand pumps were not installed even after repeated reminder to the authorities and the available water resources had not been functioning properly for a long time. Neither the women nor the children had been getting enough safe drinking water. When members of the SHGs came to know about this, they discussed the matter and took a resolution to raise a voice against it. They approached the concerned committee member of the village twice and requested them to mend their ways. Having seen no response from councilors, the SHG members met the Pradhan and apprised him of the situation. The Pradhan promised to look into the matter. He kept his words and instructed the concerned authorities to install the hand pumps to have safe drinking water. The collectivism worked and since then it has been working properly with regular maintenance.

Visual impairment not a barrier for transformation



The story is about the courage of Pooja, D/o Babulal, village Chamaru, Pindra block, Varanasi. Having no sight, she as a student she went through a lot of suffering, pain of losing friends, studies and even the love of parents. The school children called her blind, she was humiliated and they made fun of her. His father worked as a daily wage laborer. Many of the nights she had to sleep outside her house. She was very much discouraged and had a miserable helpless life. During this time the animators of JVS enrolled her in the SSI programme and it was a turning point in her life. The programme helped her to change her attitudes towards the circumstances and she began responding positively. Now blessed with a beautiful voice she sings and is participating in every activity. She took her visual impairment in a positive way. Day after day the staff used to discuss with her and encourage her. This helped to develop his knowledge and he started to love and obey his parents. Now she is going to school and is also interested in cooking and doing every household activity and is dearly loved by her parents too. The regular counseling and interaction from the staff taught her to face the pain and fear and perform better in his life. Now there is a transformation in her life and she is equipping himself to face the challenges of life.

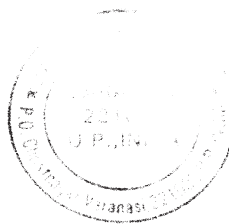




