ABOUT JVS

Jan Vikas Samiti (JVS) was established in 1996 and registered under Societies Registration Act, 1860. Since its inception JVS has been working for the integral development of the marginalized and underprivileged sections of the society, including women, children and persons with disabilities. JVS is directly implementing programmes on Rehabilitation of Children and Youngsters with Disabilities, Women Empowerment, Promotion of Community Health, WASH, Livelihood, Skill Development, etc. Over the years, JVS has been engaged in creating an inclusive society by enabling access to education, skill development and rights.

Vision

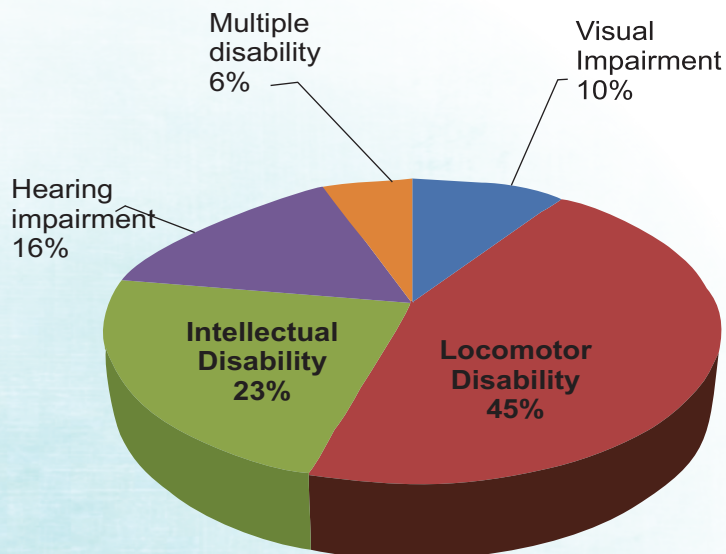
We visualize the formation of an inclusive and humane society based on the values of equity, justice and freedom.

Mission

Empowerment of the marginalized people of the society, especially the women, children, the scheduled caste and persons with disabilities through a process of awareness building, people's organization, collective action, and advocacy for raising their socio-political, educational, economic and health status and promotion of environment.

PARTERSHIP APPROACH

Inclusive Development of Children and Youngsters with Disabilities: In Strategic partnership with Liliane Foundation, the Netherlands and through partnership network of 66 Partner Organizations in 15 states of North and North East India, JVS reached out to 6330 children and youngsters with disabilities in order to ensure and promote their overall development in terms of health, education, livelihood, social inclusion and empowerment.



Major achievements during the year

- The health of 1827 children and youngsters with disabilities improved with our support for medication, corrective surgeries and orthotic - prosthetic aids and appliances.
- Ninety-five youngsters with disabilities completed graduation, while another 23 completed post-graduation.
- Twenty-eight youngsters with disabilities completed professional courses like D.Ed., B.Ed., LLB, MCA, MSW, Engineering and Nursing while 112 completed vocational courses.
- Fifty-two youngsters with disabilities got job in various departments like in teaching, call centre, accounting, computer operation, hospitality services etc. in either private or government sectors.
- Six hundred and ninety-two children and youngsters with disabilities were linked with government social protection schemes such as disability certificates, ADIP (assistance to disabled persons for purchase of aids/appliances), pension, scholarships, railway and bus pass, niramaya, etc.
- Two thousand eight hundred and sixty children and youngsters with disabilities improved their social participation in community activities.
- The financial stability of five hundred and ninety-six families of youngsters with disabilities improved with small scale local livelihood enterprises initiated by them.
- Effective campaigns for protection of the rights of persons with disabilities were launched and carried out by partners especially in Meghalaya, Assam, Bihar, West Bengal and Uttar Pradesh.



Tele-Rehabilitation “Sambhav”: is the clinical application of consultative, preventive, diagnostic, and therapeutic rehabilitation services via two-way interactive telecommunication technology. It is developed to provide reasonable access to geographically remote individuals and to those who are physically and economically disadvantaged. It also has the capacity to improve the quality of rehabilitation health care. Tele-rehabilitation

relates to the services delivered by several health disciplines including physiotherapy, speech pathology occupational therapy and biomedical engineering. It optimizes the timing, intensity and duration of therapy that is often not possible within the constraints of face-to-face treatment protocols in the current health systems. The project aims to capacitate CBR facilitators on rehabilitation diagnosis, making custom made treatment/rehabilitation plans and providing appropriate therapies to the children and youth with disabilities who are most in need in the rural parts of India using recent technology. The main purpose and focus of the project Sambhav is the application of the web portal and mobile app for the purpose of assessment and rehabilitation plan, progress and outcomes. Physical rehabilitation service was provided to 325 children with disabilities from 5 states with the support of 8 partner organizations.



Inclusive Education: In partnership with Liliane Foundation, the Netherlands, CBM, India and Light for the World, Austria, a 5 year programme on Inclusive Education called “RAISE” has been carried out. The aim of the project is to support 15 local NGOs to become Resource Centres for Inclusive Education and to link each NGO with 3 to 5 neighbourhood SSA schools to improve the quality of Inclusive Education in the SSA schools. Under the project, key teachers are trained as master

trainers who further train their own colleagues and the teachers in the SSA schools. In partnership with 2 local NGOs, a similar but small programme on Inclusive Education is also being implemented in Lucknow, Barabanki and Sitapur of Uttar Pradesh. The highlights of these two programmes during the year were:

- One hundred and twenty SSA teachers were trained in Inclusive Education, TLM Development and Child Safeguarding.
- Eight teachers were trained in sign language and 13 teachers were trained in Assessment and Evaluation Methodology.
- Basic Manual on Inclusive Education (25 sessions) was completed and Advanced Manual (13 sessions spread over 100 hours) was finalized and uploaded on Nearpod.com
- RAISE North East Project received the Award “**Innovative Practice 2020**” by Zero Project Networks for 2020.
- Infrastructure modification in 12 SSA schools were completed.



MIVA Block Grant: JVS, within strategic partnership with MIVA Netherlands reached out to a total of 18 partner and non-partner organizations during the year 2019-20 by supporting them with means of transport and communications to facilitate and enhance their work. While 7 NGOs were supported with four wheelers and one with two-wheeler 10 other NGOs were given either a laptop, camera, sound system or LCD projector.

Computer Skills for Inclusive Employment:

The project runs two training centres; one in Varanasi, U.P., and the other in Betul, M.P. The project aims at imparting skills in basic computer and accounting software (tally) to equip the rural youth with basic qualifications to make them employable in institutions and small or medium companies. Forty-five youngsters from economically weaker communities completed the six months training during the year.



IMPLEMENTATION APPROACH

JVS through its many direct implementation programmes responds to the needs of the underprivileged and marginalized sections of the society, especially women, children and the economically weaker groups in the society.

Women Empowerment & Promoting Inclusive Livelihood:

In collaboration with Missio München, Germany and Manos Unidas, Spain, efforts were made during the year to create alternative and sustainable livelihood opportunities for women and persons with disabilities through focused skill training and setting up micro ventures.

Eight hundred and thirty-nine women were trained for 3 to 15 days in production of various products like detergent powder, cloth and nonwoven bags, LED bulbs, paper plates, nutritional supplements and sanitary pad packaging and also marketing of these products. Out of these trained women, 440 women are regularly engaged in production and sales.



497 Inclusive Self-Help Groups were formed with 6725 total members

26477 women and adolescent girls were sensitized on their rights and social entitlements through different training programmes and other awareness events.

Distribution of Multivitamin tablets to Pregnant Women:

JVS, with support of "Vitamin Angels" distributed multivitamin and iron tablets to 479 pregnant and lactating mothers in Harahua and Pindra blocks in Varanasi and Kerakat block in Jaunpur, Uttar Pradesh. 5845 children in these blocks were also provided with vitamin A tablets and Albendazole dose.



Community Mobilization for Safe Motherhood:

JVS has been working in Harahua block for the last three years on reducing maternal and infant mortality rate through community mobilization programme. As a result of this intervention it has been observed that families have become aware of health related issues like taking care of reproductive health; consulting doctors for pre & post-natal care, going for institutional delivery, ensuring health & hygiene, giving routine immunizations for mother & child, taking nutritional supplements and having better knowledge about social and health related issues.

Major achievements were:

- Institutional delivery - 442
- Village Health Committee formed - 15
- Immunization of children - 740
- Health Camps - 12 covering 961 people



Secured, Hygienic and Healthful Living for Girls :

This is a three-year project being implemented in Durgawati block of Kaimur District, Bihar. The objective of the project is to ensure sanitation coverage in 25 schools and 50 below poverty line (BPL) households having girl children by sensitizing various stakeholder like the members of the Panchayati Raj Institutions (PRIs), Village Water and Sanitation Committees (VWSCs), District level Water and Sanitation Committees (DWSC), SHG members, parents and field functionaries etc.

The following have been achieved during the year.

- PRI members meeting - 43
- Workshop for Village Water and Sanitation Committee - 2
- Construction of disable friendly toilets in schools - 5
- Construction of toilets for families - 9
- School Management Committee Meeting - 11
- Community Meetings with parents and adolescent girls – 798



Food & Beverage Service Management Training: 48 youngsters with disabilities completed a six-month residential course on Food and Beverage Service Management, of which 25 were successfully placed in hotels and restaurants.



Inclusive Children's Parliament:

In order to promote active participation of children in decision making process in the society, JVS formed village to state level children's parliament by organizing trainings at different level. There are 1995 children in 70 villages of 4 districts namely Varanasi, Jaunpur, Chanduali, and Muhammadabad in Uttar Pradesh as members of children's parliament.



Story of Change

Bablu Kumar a youngster affected by cerebral palsy hailing from Koderma district of Jharkhand has proved himself a working professional by being an expert in computer based data management systems. Post completion of his matric studies, he started his own online business at Domchanj, Koderma district.

Soon he mastered his skills in data management through which he was able to secure a job in Praghya Kendra of Domchanj Block Development Office.



Muskaan Rehabilitation and Resource Centre:

Muskaan is a day care centre for children with intellectual and learning disabilities. A total of 32 children with disabilities attend the centre for regular therapeutic and rehabilitation services. Each of these children have individual educational and therapeutic programme as per their individual need



Community-Based Screening of High-Risk Group (HRG) and At-Risk Group (ARG) Population:

JVS, in partnership with SAATHII, implemented the project called “Solidarity and Action Against The HIV Infection in India (Sahay)” in Prayagnagar and Siddharth Nagar and Varanasi. later it was extended to other five districts namely Bagpat, Saharanur, Gautam Buddh Nagar, Agra and Muzaffarpur in western UP.

Community Based Screenings (CBS) are conducted to leverage current test and treat paradigms to maximize immediate/early ART initiation for individuals testing HIV positive to reduce disease progression and further viral transmission. 5437 testing were done through 114 CBS and 35 individuals found positive.

ग्रामीण महिलाओं ने सीखा पेपर प्लेट बनाने का हुनर

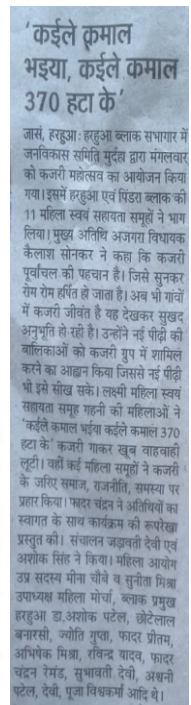

ग्रामीण महिलाओं को किया हुनरमंद

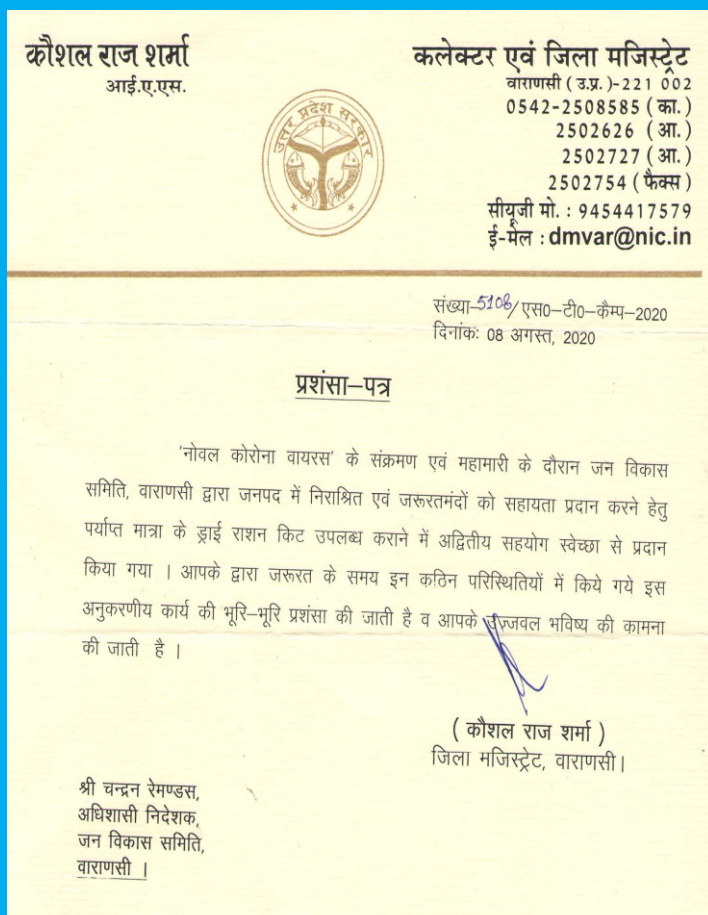
